


GREECE 2024 THE STEPS OF PAUL

Dr. Tom Johnston and I have been meeting together on and off for the past 10 years. During that time, he has been a wonderful mentor and guiding voice in matters of evangelism and ministry. In 2020, when he moved to Bemidji, Minnesota to care for his in-laws, out of necessity our in-person meetings became digital meetings. In this, I saw an opportunity to share with others the insightful conversations that I had enjoyed for so long. Thus, 'The 1689 Evangelism Podcast' was born.

'The 1689 Evangelism Podcast' is an attempt to address what we see as a critical issue in the church today: the lack of Biblical evangelism. We want to encourage churches to prioritize evangelism while maintaining sound doctrinal commitments rooted in the Word of God. We believe that the Bible is sufficient to give us both our message and our method for fulfilling the Great Commission. With this understanding, we encourage people to be active in evangelism while also avoiding what we believe to be attractional pitfalls. The cunning of man cannot and will not save the sinner. The gospel alone holds the power of God unto salvation. The Church needs a renewed commitment to the undiluted gospel. We need a revival of Biblical evangelism.

In each episode, Dr. Johnston and I take a doctrinal prompt from the 1689 London Baptist Confession, which then launches us into a conversation about how Biblical Doctrine affects the way we do evangelism. We've already discussed topics such as 'Evangelism & The Gospel', 'Evangelism & Baptism', 'Evangelism & Family Worship', 'Evangelism and Mission Drift', and many more.
