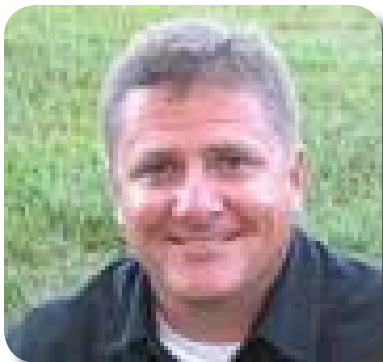

## GOSPEL OUTREACH

### People Teams

It is important to report some of the ways that God has answered your prayers for the Nations this year. Here are some of the highlights:



Somalis - The LORD brought a Somali believer to our city. Pray for him as he grows in his faith and begins to reach other Somalis. Praise God for this brother, and pray for those discipling him.

Somali Bantus - The LORD has raised up two churches to focus on ministering to the Bantus. One has been on this journey for six years, and their members are more and more committed to the families they know and love. A new church is strongly committed to reaching this unreached group as well. The commitment of these groups is a great encouragement to others striving among the unreached.

Youth - One of the major prayer requests from almost every ethnic church was for their youth. They are becoming Americans, and they have a difficult time accepting the faith of their parents when their home language and culture is becoming less and less relevant in their lives. They spend worship services sitting in the back on their phones because they don't understand the language. But this doesn't mean that they aren't interested in Jesus. Two youth groups have formed in the South Sudanese and Arabic speaking churches to help these churches disciple their teens and reach other teenagers who are far from God. This seems to be an answer to the prayers from the pastors. Perhaps the model will continue to spread in order to reach 2nd and 3rd generation immigrants.

Iraqis and Kurds - The LORD is using the crisis in Iraq to bring people to us and to create an openness to dialog about Truth. Pray for the deep relationships that believers have been able to form with various Iraqis and Kurds around the city.

Gulf Arab Students - Although it is difficult to reach Gulf Arabs, some have recently begun to understand the message when they have experienced worship and church life in their own language. Pray for those who are close to committing their lives to Christ, and pray for those who are reaching out to them.



Haitians - Every Haitian that I have met has a respect for the LORD and a spirit of hospitality. Pray that God continues to work through their openness in the Haitian churches of Kansas City and that they can bring salt and light to other peoples in Kansas City. Ritchi is a teenager mentioned by name in the prayer guide. Through your prayers, he is gaining a burden to reach his Muslim friends

for Christ.

Burmese Muslims, Karen, and Chin - The LORD has formed a new **Karen Church** this year very close to the Burmese Muslim community. This church is a blessing to the neighborhood through making disciples of over one hundred Karen. Its presence provides a light in the park across the street.

Hispanics.- Only the LORD knows all that is happening among Hispanics in Kansas City, but this year **Palabra Viva** founded the International Welcome Center to reach out to internationals through English classes, legal services, and other services soon to come such as driving lessons, job searches, and support groups in addition to the Bible studies and worship services. Volunteers are needed!

First Tuesdays - The LORD has formed a group of believers with hearts to reach internationals that meets on the first Tuesday of each month at **Eleos Coffee House**. This is a great place for networking and training in the mission of reaching all nations in Kansas City. Each time that a person from an unreached people group hears the Gospel and interacts with a believer is deeply significant. Keep praying!

## **Horn of Africa**

Our BR-KC mission outreach among Eritreans began in 2011 as we sought the Lord's leading in adopting a largely unengaged and unreached people group. After much prayer, research, and onsite visiting, we believed God would have us work long term for the spiritual and physical well being of the Eritrean people. Our initial door of opportunity was to minister to Eritreans in the refugee camps of northern Ethiopia. In this endeavor, we have partnered with Innovative Humanitarian Solutions for humanitarian, education and spiritual outreach in Eritrean refugee camps. We have provided clothing, sports equipment, food and thousands of books.

### **Library**

In 2014, members of BR-KC churches donated over 8,000 children's books, academic textbooks, Bibles and spiritual books in English to stock libraries in two refugee camps. However, as thousands of additional refugees continued to arrive, the need for edification and education grew as well. So, in 2015, our churches and members did it again. We collected close to 20,000 books this time. In July, our mission team was able to get the first library set up and open for business! As you read this, our second shipment of books nears the port in Djibouti where they will continue on to Shire for distribution to additional libraries and schools being built by the UNHCR. A huge thank you to the ladies of **Noland Road Baptist Church** for processing and organizing the books.



### **Bible School**

As a result of two trips per year for four years now, the Lord has developed a partnership with the Evangelical Church of Shire, Ethiopia. From this partnership, the need for a Bible School for both Ethiopian and Eritrean evangelical pastors was discovered.



In January, our team was able to partner with the Evangelical Church to hold the inaugural session of the Bible School. Since Thomas went to Ethiopia, we are not aware that there has been another Bible school in the Tigray region of Ethiopia. During the week, Randy Messer, pastor of **FBC Oak Grove**, Gregg Boll, and Dr. Asefaw Indrias taught a group of Ethiopian and Eritrean pastors. Some had traveled a great distance to learn. In July, we took another group of teachers, this time including MBTS professors. Dr. Asefaw Indrias and Dr. Robin Hadaway taught World Religions and New Testament Survey II. The Bible School had begun construction on a second floor which will provide dormitory space and additional classroom space. Jim Brown and Mark Roberts worked alongside Ethiopian brothers in building the second floor of the Bible School. Meanwhile,

Nicole Brown and Candy Roberts led children's ministries of VBS, educational outreach to refugee children, and organized the newly built library. The Browns and Roberts are from **Noland Road Baptist Church**, a lead partner in this work!

### **Fundraising Efforts**

A second "Walk for the Horn" took place on a cold Saturday in April. Sixteen individuals set out from the campus of Drake University in Des Moines, Iowa at 5:30 a.m. but only 5 would go the distance. Their goal was to raise funds and awareness for the Horn of Africa



Library being built in a refugee camp in northern Ethiopia. This group, led by Luke Hammer, now a Junior at Drake, made the 34 mile trek from Drake to Iowa State University in Ames in just over 12 1/2 hours, running the last mile and a half. Luke raised over \$1000. This is Luke's second Walk. The first was in 2013 when he and a friend from Summit Christian Academy walked 28 miles raising a total of \$1,500.

We had some of our churches host BBQ fundraisers last fall. **FBC Grandview, Antioch Southern, Oakwood and Noland Road** provided our team the opportunity to cook and serve fresh burgers and dogs. Free will offerings were received.

#### Future Goals

We are exploring the possibility of adding a medical aid component to future trips. God seems to be opening many doors and providing us opportunities to expand our missions and ministry efforts among the Eritrean and Ethiopian peoples. Please continue to pray for this ministry and for the teams that go. The next trips are January 4-16, 2016, and June 27-July 9, 2016. See our website for more information and application.

#### Vancouver Partnership

As I write this I am in Vancouver. I am thinking of some ways to make a few points that might generate a bit more motivation from our churches to get involved in our partnership here. First, Canada is a foreign country. You may say well of course it is. And yet I think we tend to see Canada in general as a friendly northern area rather than a genuine foreign place like we would Africa or say, South America. We also tend not to see it as a lost dark place. Its beauty and grandeur affects our ability to see it in this way. Maybe this might help. Vancouver itself has become 40% Asian. Mostly Chinese. Richmond is fast becoming the true China Town of North America. This really became apparent to me as I watched David Loveland, pastor of **Grace Heartland Community Church**, who came with me interact with Asian speaking people. David is fluent in Mandarin Chinese. It amazed me how they responded to a US citizen who spoke their language. It was also eye opening to tour Richmond and see how Chinese it is becoming. This people group among others is also spreading into our partnership areas of Coquitlam and Port Moody. Second, we have church planters in our partner areas that are losing financial resources that need to be replaced and continued in 2016. We have a new church plant launching as we speak in Port Moody. They need support on every level.



60% are of other ethnic descents. What is shocking is that over 40% of the total population of Vancouver say they have no religion. The rest is very superficial in their designations of their religious choices. Less than 2% say they are born again Christians. This is a foreign country, not just a friendly neighbor of the U.S. This means church planters, church partners, and mission groups are sorely needed. BR-KC Assoc. has chosen this Send City to partner with. Please consider committing money, mission teams, and other resources to this partnership. Please contact me or the BR-KC Association office if you are interested in doing this. This is not an after thought. It is a priority that I hope we will take seriously.

The 2015 Vancouver Church Planters Retreat was another great success attracting over 60 participants from the Vancouver area. This year we had a great team from the BR-KC Baptist Association which included members from **Blue Ridge Baptist, LifeQuest, FBC Blue Springs and FBC Grandview**. The retreat also featured Mark Wester from Denver, Colorado as the key note speaker. The retreat included worship, devotionals, rest and recreation, group interaction and very relevant topics to help and encourage these church planters.

#### Campus Ministry

Impact is a ministry that brings the gospel of Jesus to the University of Missouri – Kansas City, Rockhurst University, and the surrounding neighborhoods. This past year the students and community members of Impact accomplished much through the power of God for the fame of God. We began the school year baking 40







dozen cookies to deliver to neighbors (students and nonstudents) of Troostwood where my wife and I live. This simple act demonstrated to our neighborhood a desire to know and care for them. We welcomed over 70 people into our home whether that be through weekly Friday night dinners where conversations would occasionally provide opportunities to share the gospel, hosting Story of God gatherings where unbelievers learned alongside believers the Bible's overarching narrative of redemption, or various social events like a Super Bowl or Valentine's Day party that helped establish new friendships. We served our neighborhood by picking up trash every week, making preparations for a community garden, and teaming up with 20 other Rockhurst students to clean up the neighborhood park. We gathered regularly for prayer, Bible study, "family meals", small group accountability, and one-on-one discipleship.

This school year, in addition to our continued ministry above, we have launched Impact Intensives, a yearlong training for students who want to learn what it looks like to follow Jesus in every area of life. Impact Intensives combine Biblical teaching, small group discussions, hands on applications, group problem solving activities, and one-on-one mentoring for a holistic process of growth.

Also this school year, we have gathered students (Christian and non-Christian) together to raise awareness of Human Trafficking and partner with Restoration House of Greater Kansas City as well as partnering with Innovative Humanitarian Solutions to provide aid to Eritrean refugees in northern Ethiopia.

I am confident God will use these new ministries to make disciples, lead people to Jesus, and display the Kingdom of God to a hurting world.

Our ministry always welcomes your prayers. Specifically, join us in praying for many of the 17,000 UMKC students, faculty, and administrators; the 2,500 Rockhurst students, faculty, and administrators; and the thousands of surrounding community members to be saved. Pray for God to raise up laborers for the harvest (men and women in and around the universities to help us make disciples). Pray for wisdom for me and our leaders to know how best to proclaim and display the good news of Jesus. Pray for a growing affection within our community for God. Pray for protection from the Enemy's attempts to discourage, disunite, and destroy our community on mission.

### **Blue River Community College**

God opened up doors of opportunity to connect with a faculty member at Blue River this past spring. After explaining that she'd been disconnected from any kind of church since her college days, I invited her to join **LifeConnection Church** on a Sunday morning. She attended regularly for a couple months and even joined my small group this past spring. Additionally, I facilitated a Monday Bible discussion through John's Gospel with 7-10 students. One student brought her husband to LifeConnection and are currently attending. Another former student has connected with our church in the past year along with her fiancé. I've been investing in him this past year on a weekly/bi-weekly basis to help him grow in Christ.



This semester is off to a great start. I've met many new students and see lots of ministry potential this fall. Just this week I met 4 students—none of whom are believers—who've accepted my invitation to join me for an Exploring God discussion group. We'll meet every other Wednesday on campus. We'll begin by considering the question, "Does my life have a purpose?" as we look to God's Word together.

### **Longview Community College**

Last semester, I partnered with another student pastor in Lee's Summit and several students we've been investing in to launch The

Alpha Course. Alpha is a safe, no pressure environment best suited for students with doubts, questions, and objections to the faith. As a result, I've been able to establish a friendship with an Alpha guest who's currently the president of the Gay Straight Alliance at Longview. Though he's currently skeptical, he's open spiritually. He and I have plans to meet on Wednesday afternoons to read and discuss a Christian book together.



I'm also meeting with a small group of students on Thursdays at noon. We're gathering to plan and implement servant evangelism projects on campus—serving students with no strings attached in Christ's name. We'll also be inviting students to join an Explore God group that will meet every other Thursday on campus. Additionally, a Muslim joined us and invited me to dialogue with other Muslim students about faith on Thursdays. She expressed an interest in learning about the Bible and Christianity—how the two faiths are similar and how they're different. I think this is an incredible opportunity to share the gospel with Muslim students while building new friendships with them.

Please continue to pray for God's leading and discernment as well as divine opportunities to share Christ with students and faculty. Thank you!

## ***RESOURCING CHURCHES AND EQUIPPING LEADERS***

Over the last few years we have chosen to provide training opportunities for our churches and pastors based on feedback from surveys and personal conversations with them in order to be truly helpful and good stewards of the resources you give us. I want to personally thank Jerry Tharp, pastor of **Lone Jack Baptist**, for producing a survey to discern the greatest needs of our pastors and for catering the meals for this year's Williams-Farmer Preaching Fellowship and Leadership Training event.

Our churches have continued to desire VBS training for their workers which we provided in April with nearly 70 in attendance. Our pastors continue to express a desire for training in four basic areas: church revitalization; preaching; leadership; and encouragement/fellowship. We have invited pastors to help us design these ministries and events and have offered the following exceptional opportunities:

- E3 Pastor's Luncheon – Pastors meet for lunch quarterly with other pastors in their area to share victories and burdens and pray for one another.
- Legacy Cohort – Pastors and key lay leaders meet monthly to learn and share ministry ideas for revitalizing declining or plateaued churches.
- In partnership with the Missouri Baptist Convention, we hosted a T4T Discipleship Training Conference at **Fellowship Greenwood** in March to model a disciple multiplying strategy being used by many of our missionaries overseas and by indigenous pastors and church leaders.
- In February, in conjunction with the Missouri Baptist Convention, we offered a Kingdom Diversity Conference at **United Believers Community Church** to explain how the Cooperative Program is a core value of Southern Baptists and the value of being a cooperating church.
- In April we hosted our annual Williams-Farmer Preaching Fellowship at **Wornall Road Baptist Church** led by Dr. Robert Smith, Jr., Preaching Professor at Beeson Seminary, along with a panel of gifted preachers from the area.
- Leadership Training Event – On September 8th Scott Patty, Pastor of Nashville's Grace Community Church led a seminar on how to develop an intentional discipleship strategy for enlisting and equipping future leaders in your church. We are currently planning another leadership training event for the spring of 2016.



Additionally, through our conversations with pastors we have learned that there is still confusion and a desire for information about how the church can protect itself from litigation and harassment in the wake of the Supreme Court ruling on same-sex marriage. We have been working with churches individually and referring them to good resources for amending their constitution and bylaws to address this threat.

Finally, we consult individually with several of our churches and their pastors each year providing requested information and guidance on the following:

- Conducting an effective pastor search process
- Helping pastorless churches find a quality interim pastor
- Advice on how to implement an effective outreach or discipleship ministry
- Resolving church conflict
- Intervening to help pastors dealing with personal crisis to find healing, personal assessment and professional counseling to restore them to fruitful ministry when possible.
- Helping churches self-assess and consulting to bring about a healthier church
- Helping struggling churches find stronger partner churches to come alongside them for support, encouragement and greater kingdom impact upon their community.



We are here to serve you and your church but we need your feedback to know better how to do that. We are honored when you reach out to us for assistance so let us know how we can serve you.

RHGKC holds volunteer education and awareness meetings on the third Thursday of each month at **Heart of Life Church** in Lee's Summit. Volunteers are trained on important topics about sex trafficking. We have touched on topics such as Language Matters,

Deceptions Curriculum, Stories from Restoration House, Chosen videos and more. We also offer break-out sessions for volunteer teams such as food/clothing donation drives, maintenance, speaker's bureau and gala fundraising. ## **Forest Avenue Family Shelter**

The Forest Avenue Family Shelter has been a Southern Baptist Shelter for 30 years. This year the shelter became the largest non-screening women's emergency shelter in the Kansas City Metro. This year, we have seen a 30% rise in the number of homeless women and children. As is well known, we have always taken people right off of the street. We do not screen them first. This has always included single women, single women with children, battered women, and sex trafficking victims.



We experienced the death of our boiler two months before the end of last winter was over. For two months we were without hot water due to no extra money to buy a hot water heater. These things caused us to have to turn away calls during this time. Giving for the past two years has been cut in half. As you know for 30 years we have operated with just enough money to pay lights, gas and water. The great staff we have had over the years have always been all volunteer. We are so grateful for the \$300 the Blue River Kansas City Association sends us each month. While our giving has dropped since the end of 2013, our numbers have grown especially among women and children. Due to the shut downs we only kept 9,000 guest for the year. This meant about 4,500 less than we kept in previous years.

We have taken in to date \$650 for the heating to be replaced. By God's grace two heaters have been donated. We now have learned that we need \$12,000 for the duct work for the heating for the two floors. Based on the present rate of giving having heat in the shelter building is still pending.

We have had roughly 25 people saved over this past year. This too is down due to the closings. Presently we have seven people who are in our Deeper Life Discipleship Program. Again we are so grateful for the \$300 we get monthly from Blue River Kansas city Association. We are also grateful for the churches who come and serve meals and do chapel each week.

## **Multiethnic Church Planting Center**

2015 has been a blessed and eventful year for the Multiethnic Church Planting Center (MECPC). We have concentrated our attention studying our community and their specific needs for the purpose of learning about them and being able to implement strategies that can help us to better minister to the international people groups.



Based on that objective, we created the International Welcome Center to provide support for internationals residing in Kansas City. We have been able to help with free services such as ESL classes, immigration/legal services, family support groups, driving lessons, healthcare and job development. Another objective is to build the necessary infrastructure and programs so local churches can actively contribute in this process; all of this with the intention of building bridges that will grant us the privilege of sharing the gospel with them and leading the international community to Christ. We are grateful for several churches that have become involved in this effort. They have helped us

by providing some necessary items for the Welcome Center and they became actively involved in some of the events we have had throughout the year.

Every week we are providing ESL classes for the community, immigration assistance as needed, discovering, coaching and guidance for potential church planters on a regular basis, and eye clinics at least every six months. Through these efforts, we have developed a better relationship with the international community. We have been able to visit them at their homes and spend time with them, meeting their families and relatives and learning more about their personal situations and challenges. Also, as part of this strategy, we have seen at least 35 people come to Christ, 6 people rededicated their lives to Christ and many of them have given us the opportunity to share our faith with them. We are always looking for the persons of peace that will grant us the possibility of influencing and impacting a whole people group with the gospel and the transformation this can bring to the lives of a whole community.



The Multiethnic Church Planting Center has also been an instrument in God's hand to facilitate church planter assessments for international leaders. Last June we had our last assessment for potential Hispanic church planters. This year we also had the opportunity to open the doors of our facilities for the Emmanuel Karen Baptist Church, a group of Christian believers coming from Burma and belonging to the Karen tribe. They have been worshipping at the MECPC since last July. We have been providing coaching and advice for them in the process of how they can become an established church here in Kansas City. This group has been a blessing in our midst because their presence accomplishes one of the main objectives of the Center, allowing people from different cultures and backgrounds to worship God in their heart language in a safe and welcoming environment.

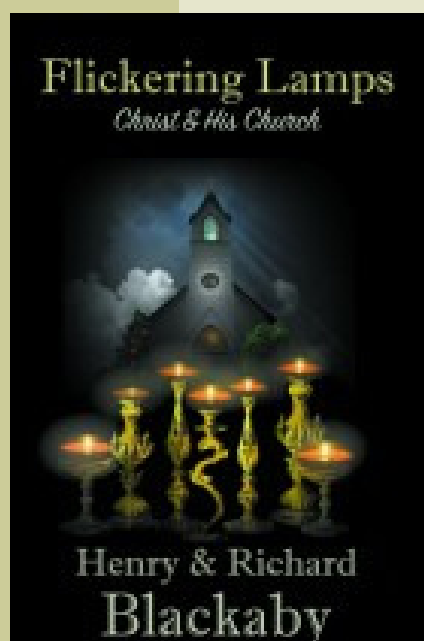
