


Vision 2020 Grant Money... Helping Churches and Communities

Each quarter, the BR-KC Baptist Association gives away over \$29,000 to assist churches in their efforts to impact their community and the world with the gospel of Jesus Christ. This money is provided by the Vision 2020 Grant Fund, made possible by the sale of the Association's Mission Center in 2014. During the fourth quarter of 2015, **United Believers Community Church** applied for three grants from the Association's Vision 2020 Grant Fund. Below is a report on the use of these funds.

Gospel Outreach

We printed 1,000 children's books and disseminated them to six urban schools and within the radius of 29th Street to Truman and Van Brunt to Prospect. This wide



array was catapulted by nearly 125 volunteers who made sure homes were touched with the Gospel. The book is evangelistic in nature and creative in its instructional content. Also, the material content was developed by current and former school teachers and administrators. To note, the artwork throughout the book

was produced by a locally well-known artist.

Church Planting

We have planted a sister congregation called CONNECTIONS CHURCH. This unique ministry meets congregationally on Saturday evenings at 5:30 pm for a one hour service. Also, it reaches an audience daily through their web-based ministry inclusive of YouTube, live stream, On Demand, and

various social media outlets. This congregation will grow numerically and the grant has provided us the ability to reduce our rent for their service by 50%, buy new equipment (speakers, sound board, etc) due to shared space and technology use and provide an electronic keyboard to aid them in their weekly service. On a regular and consistent basis, we continue to impart hope and encouragement to the pastor



and core leaders by providing them resources and insight on how to perform effective ministry.


Additionally, we hosted a roundtable of church planters and small churches and gave out and touched eight congregations with cases of Bibles for evangelism, seven urban pastors with on-going formative development in their ministry context and gave each of them trustworthy content and research from our African American Pastors Fellowship on a national

level. We are meeting presently with seven pastors going through the book Disciples Path. They are given

a free copy and kit and we discuss how to make our front door approach to church and Christ (assimilation process) more fluid and effective.

Resourcing Churches

We are grateful for this allocation of funds that helped us to complete a \$50,000 capital improvement renovation to the former Greendale Baptist Church property currently known as United Believers Church, North Campus. The grant funds helped us to settle the remaining debt owed. Thank you BRKC for partnering with us to beautify the church and improve the look of this community!



Church Planter Spotlight

Manna Fellowship came to Belton, Missouri via a slight detour from Africa.

In 2013, Pastor Rick Friesen left the staff of a vibrant suburban church to answer God's call to missions. Although he lives in the Kansas City area, Rick has traveled the nation and the globe to raise funds and awareness to combat Africa's spiritual and physical hunger.

As a director for Manna Worldwide, a global missions and relief agency, Rick partners with individuals and churches to start nutrition centers, orphanages, water purification systems and congregations throughout Africa.

The work in Africa was challenging and rewarding. Yet God had more in store.

Nearly 20 years ago, Rick accepted the call to local pastoral ministry. He still felt that calling, but the work in Africa was urgent. He wrestled in prayer, trying to resolve the tension. Something had to give. Or did it?

God eventually revealed to Rick that, through Christ's power, he could serve both causes. Soon after, Manna Fellowship Church was born in Rick's living room in 2015 and now meets in a dedicated building in Belton. It's a unique church dedicated to meeting the spiritual and practical needs of Belton, Raymore, Peculiar and Cass County. Yet it has a vision that extends around the globe.



We chose Belton because it's a community with many practical needs. 16 percent of the population lives below the federal poverty level. Nearly 10% of the community is Hispanic. Yet it's diverse, with neighborhoods spanning nearly all income groups.

We started with 8 people in our home. We are now in a building with more than 100 attending.

In the past year we've discovered the meaning of Ephesians 3:20, that God is able to do more than we can ask or

imagine. Here are some things we are grateful to God for:

- We worship in a rent-free building.
- The church has been able to bring Pastor Rick on full-time.
- We've been able to reach our community through works of mercy.
- Our congregation has generously supported an orphanage in Kenya and five missionaries.
- We've been able to support Missouri Baptist causes on a monthly basis.
- Finally, we've seen 10 salvations and 20 baptisms.
- 16 people have gone through a one-on-one systematic discipleship ministry.

Our biggest prayer request is that we will put God first and make a noticeable impact in our community—we want to meet spiritual and practical needs. We also will have to make a decision by this fall to go to two services or look for a larger meeting space where we can still worship together in one service with room for growth.

Manna Fellowship is pleased to be a church-planting partner with the North American Mission Board, a member of the Missouri Baptist Convention and member of BR-KC Association.

Campus Ministry Update


Carson Conover, Longview/Blue River

We baptized five people on Easter Sunday. Among those baptized was a college student at Blue River Community College named Dillon England.



I first met Dillon last fall when I invited him and several of his friends to participate in an Explore God discussion group. He then agreed to read the Gospel of Mark with me over a two month period. He and his girlfriend Britany have been attending our church on Sunday mornings ever since. He recently decided to put his faith in Jesus and follow Him in baptism.

Since Dillon's baptism, we've been spending time together every week going through a Bible study for new believers called "Just For Starters". He's learning to read the Bible, memorize Scripture, and pray. Will you pray for Dillon's ongoing growth in Christ?



I spend time on campus weekly at Longview Community College. I often converse with Muslim students. A few weeks ago, a student named Walla mentioned that she'd graduated from a private Muslim school nearby. She mentioned that her teacher once invited a Christian pastor to dialogue with her students about the Christian faith. I said that I'd love the opportunity to do the same. The next time I saw Walla, she said her teacher wanted me to come.

So, I visited the Islamic School of Greater KC! I spoke to 20 students from the 9th-10th grade class for an hour and 45 minutes. We were also joined by the principal and three teachers. I was given
