BAPTIST HOMES UPDATE

Over the Christmas holiday, I met up with Russell Marriott from the Baptist Homes & Healthcare Ministries. Russ serves as the Advancement Officer on the Community Engagement Team. He resides in the KC area and is interested in connecting with church leaders. Most recently he was serving at Criswell College in Dallas, but he also has served on staff at Midwestern Seminary and with the Billy Graham Evangelical Association.

Baptist Homes is a network of residential care campuses throughout Missouri with three locations in the KC area: Independence, Adrian, and Smithville. Baptist Homes campuses provide Christlike care, healthy food, compassionate staff, and a safe, peaceful environment, but first and foremost, home. It is with this understanding that they are purposely building a culture that puts the dignity, respect, and love of their residents first. The Baptist Homes are a ministry supported by your church through your Cooperative Program giving to the Missouri Baptist Convention. Trustees for this ministry are chosen and seated by you, the messengers of the Missouri Baptist Convention. So, this is your church's ministry to the aging.
